Youth & Family Programs

Providing children and families the resources they need to thrive

OUR IMPACT

- Distributed 10,172 supplemental food packs and 1,360 meal kits to over 356 students in 10 schools.
- Led two 8-week after school tutoring sessions (Study Buddies) for a total of 15 elementary students; 100% improved in reading fluency and comprehension.
- Distributed 1,000 backpacks to local students.
- Provided 107 kids with a free week of summer camp; 93% of parents reported high satisfaction.
- 1,431 volunteer hours completed.

Building community and support between neighbors



OUR IMPACT

- Partnered with local non-profits and community clubs to host 4 Dance courses for elementary youth and teens; 2 courses of square dance for families; 1 course of cooking classes (Bi-lingual: English/Russian); 2 parenting courses (Spanish), and 1 gardening workshop.
- Offered 10 free monthly family connection events focused on holiday fun and community building, totaling 762 total participants.
- Hosted 49 “Seeds of Change” Community Dinners (Thursdays), totaling 5,379 meals, an average of 100 meals provided each week.
- Coordinated gifts and necessities during the holiday season for 39 families through our local ECAP.
- 1,037 volunteer hours completed.

Seniors Programs

OUR IMPACT

- Provided 219 free senior fitness classes with an average of 91 unduplicated seniors served each month; 100% maintained or showed an increase in strength, balance and mobility in fitness assessments.
- Served weekly lunch 50 times, totaling over 2,419 nutritious meals served.
- Offered 176 free presentations, or special events focused on health, education, community awareness and social interaction.
- 739 volunteer hours completed

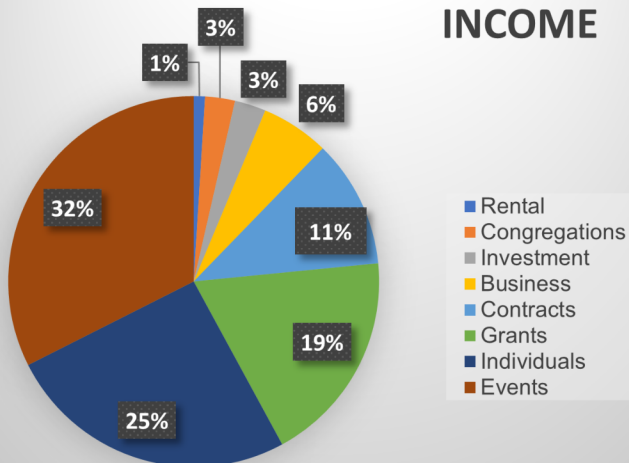

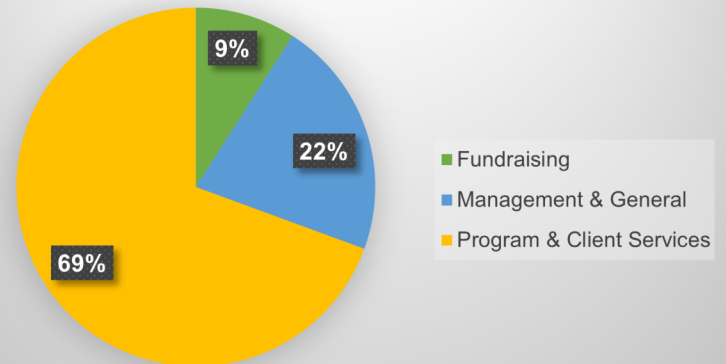


FINANCIAL REPORT
