A Message from the Interim Executive Director

Dear Friend,

As a long-time resident, volunteer, donor, and program participant at Mountain View Community Center, stepping into the role of Interim Executive Director is deeply personal for me. This isn't just a job—it's my community, my neighbors, and my own family. I've witnessed firsthand how this place changes lives, and it's the greatest honor of my professional life to serve during this important time.

I'd like to take a moment to acknowledge Jesie Holden, who led this center with passion, vision, and a deep love for the people we serve. Her work laid the foundation for so much of who we are today. I'm humbled to follow in her footsteps and grateful to our staff and Board of Directors for their steady guidance and support throughout this transition. As we look toward a season of growth, I want to share with you the incredible things happening at MVCC and the real impact your support makes possible.

March 2025 Program Highlights

This spring, we've seen strong engagement across all of our core programs; many are at or near capacity.

- In our Power Packs Youth Hunger Program, we distributed 1,198 food bags through school counselors, including 950 to Fife schools and 248 to Edgewood. Thanks to the generosity of Northwood Elementary, we also received over \$800 in donated food.
- Our **Study Buddies Tutoring Program** wrapped up its winter session with 11 students and 11 volunteer tutors. Most of the students continued from the fall, maintaining consistent mentorship. March alone saw 62 total tutoring sessions and 96 volunteer hours logged.
- Through our partnership with ECEAP-Milton, our **Souper Families Program** delivered 200 meal kits to 40 local families, ensuring weekly access to healthy meals.
- The Seeds of Change Community Dinner continues to be a space of nourishment and connection. In March, we served 463 hot meals over four Thursdays, supported by 45 volunteers contributing 91 hours of service.
 From family bingo nights to student-led service days, this program continues to bring people together.
- Our Senior Programs continue to grow and thrive. We saw 93 unduplicated fitness participants who made
 448 visits across 17 classes. Seniors also enjoyed 191 hot lunches in March and participated in engaging
 activities like Paint & Sip and themed holiday luncheons. We are also grateful to continue our partnerships
 with the UW Tacoma Nursing Program and Green River Community College, whose students bring
 intergenerational connection and enrichment to our seniors every week.

What makes MVCC truly unique is that all of these programs—every single one—remain free to those we serve. That's not just a tagline; it's a core part of our mission. And with increasing demand, we are determined to keep it that way.

Thank you for being part of this community. Whether you've donated, volunteered, shared a post, or simply walked through our doors, you're part of the MVCC story. I'm proud to stand with you in this work, and I look forward to what we'll continue building together. As we say here at the center, *It Starts With Us.*

At MVCC, one of our core values is fostering partnerships with what we call "Bridge-Builders." These individuals and organizations play a crucial role in two key ways: they share valuable knowledge that enhances skills and awareness, and they open doors to new relationships and resources. With this collaborative model, everyone benefits—and together, we grow stronger as a community. Over the past few years, MVCC has built meaningful partnerships

with both Green River Community Center (GRCC) in Auburn and the University of Washington-Tacoma (UWT). GRCC's nvolvement comes through their Occupational herapy program, while UWT's partnership is via the Bachelor of Nursing program, Through these connections, students and professionals have led engaging workshops and activities for our senior participants. These experiences are enriching for all involved. MVCC staff appreciate the students' expertise. The students gain real-world experience by applying what they're learning in class, and our seniors enjoy learning new skills while building connections with others. As one senior participant shared: "I love having the Green River students here! They challenge us to grow
